Boswell & Johnson Tour Scotland

In 1773, the Scottish James Roswell convinced his English friend Samuel Johnson to accompany him on a tour through the Highlands of Scotland. They proceeded into the Highlands and spent several weeks on various islands in the Hebrides. Each traveler published a journal of their trip.

Brian Mack's book "1773 Scotland," contains excerpts from the original text of these journals. Historically re-created paintings by Karol Mack, highlight each site that was visited. This is a superb read, highlighted by the masterful color paintings of each site by Karol Mack.

Brian Mack is the Fort Morgan Museum curator and the author of multiple books. Be sure to check out this book, and attend his author program on January 9, at 6:30 p.m. at the Fort Morgan Public Library. Copies of the book will be available for purchase at the program.

Author Brian Mack at FMPL on Jan. 9

Fort Morgan Museum Curator Brian Mack is the author of several books including "Morgan County," "One Room Schools of Morgan County," "Estes Park, Grand Lake and Rocky Mountain National Park" and "Scotland: Castles and Clans."

Brian has just released his latest book, "1773 Scotland: An Illustrated Account of Johnson & Boswell's Tour of Scotland." This book is the subject of this presenta-

tion.

This book contains excerpts from the original text of Boswell and Johnson's tour, and features historically re-created paintings of the locations visited by the travelers. This publication took over twenty years of research which began in 1998.

What makes this publication so unique are the incredible oil paintings by artist Karol Mack that are included with each featured

site. During the program, Brian will discuss many of the incredible places he visited and included in the book.

The program will be offered on Thursday, Jan. 9, at 6:30 p.m. in the Howard Rollin Community Room at the Library - Museum.
